## TREE SPECIES

1. Tulip tree, *Liriodendron tulipifera*
2. Common yew, *Taxus baccata*
3. Giant redwood, *Sequoiadendron giganteum*
4. Brewer's weeping spruce, *Picea breweriana*
5. Cedar of Lebanon, *Cedrus libani*
6. Turkey oak, *Quercus cerris* **VETERAN TREE**
7. Cypress avenue, mostly *Chamaecyparis lawsoniana*
8. Dawn redwood, *Metasequoia glyptostroboides*
9. Purple beech, *Fagus sylvatica* f. *purpurea*
10. Monkey Puzzle, *Araucaria araucana*
11. Portugal laurel, *Prunus lusitanica*
12. English oak, *Quercus robur*
13. Horse chestnut, *Aesculus hippocastanum*
14. Korean fir, *Abies koreana*
15. Tibetan cherry, *Prunus serrula*
16. Himalayan birch, *Betula utilis* var. *jacquemontii*
